15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Karnataka is the first state in the country to implement New Education Policy (NEP) from 2021-22 for all the Under Graduate programmes. New Education Policy provides an opportunity to the student to study diversified field and autonomy in the selection of the field of study in order to ensure knowledge, harmony and integrity. This institution offering B. Sc., B. Sc. (CS), B.C.A., M.Sc. and Ph.D. Programmes as well as applied , life and earth Sciences, and Humanities. Hence, it is fully prepared and geared up for offering a complete multidisciplinary and Interdisciplinary experience to its learners. Under NEP programme student can opt for subject as diverse in any combinations such as Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Mathematics, Statistics, Electronics, Computer Science, Genetics, Microbiology, Biotechnology, Geology, Ind. Fisheries, Geography, Criminology &Forensic Science and Anthropology are some of the important courses taught as DSCC ;OEC-with any interested Open Elective Course . Our Institution provided 16 DSCC for B.Sc Programme. In our College through multi Disciplinary education system, students are given more opportunities to study by electing interested and employment oriented subjects. Mandatory courses like Environmental study, India & Indian Constitution, Financial Education and others are the part of the curriculum, and value based, skill based and knowledge based activities such as Digital fluency, Artificial intelligence, fundamentals of digital logics, open source tools, cyber crime, Yoga,/sports, co-curricular and extracurricular are also included in the curricular in this institution.

In the present curriculum structure, a provision is extended for all the students to opt for multiple entries and exit in 1st year with certificate, 2nd year with Diploma, 3rd year with general degree and after completion of 4th year with Honours(Research) degree, the students will be eligible to get admission for Ph.D. programme.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The student's data of the college are already available in the University Academic Bank of Credits can be accessed through their Digi-locker. Moreover, the State Government developed UUCMS is linked with ABC. Students are getting their marks card in digital form. In the NAAC Coordinator's meeting in accordance with IQAC, Principal requests to the committee members to prepare the semester-wise calendar of events to the forth coming year programmes at the end of each academic year and to design the time table for all the U.G. and P.G. programmes and displayed the same on the college notice board and uploaded in the official website of the college. At the end of each semester, every department conducts council meeting to inform about their workload and courses for next semester, which helps the teachers to prepare a teaching plan, in advance, for the next academic assignment. IQAC provides all the teachers with a teachers work dairy to record their lecture plans and work execution details.

Teachers refer standard reference books prescribed by the university. As per the time table bridge courses are conducted for all the semester students and based on performance remedial classes were conducted for slow learners. Examination Process and Reforms: As per the University's examination rules two internal theory (IA 1 & IA 2) and one practical (IA) examinations are conducted. Centralized Continuous Internal Evaluation system (CIE) is adopted to maintain the

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academic standard of the Institution. The evaluation report is made available on the College and department notice boards and also uploaded in the College website. Grievances of the students if any are addressed within stipulated time. Based on the CIE report, slow learners are identified and remedial classes are conducted for such students.

Evaluation Process and reforms: Bar coding: Every answer paper is given a barcode. Students register number along with a copy of the barcode is physically removed before the evaluation and the paper is coded. The coded answer papers are assessed and decoded. Results will be announced by the university.

Photocopy, Revaluation and Third Revaluation: Students are permitted to get the photocopy of their answer scripts. Provisions are also made for revaluation, third evaluation and challenge evaluation.

By employing student-centric approaches, KarnatakScience College assists, announces, and disseminates knowledge among the students. Bridge courses are compulsorily conducted in all subjects at the beginning of every semester to ensure their understanding of key concepts.

Slow learners

Slow learners are identified based on their performance in internal tests. Students who were ill and unable to represent the college in various events or attend exams were provided with another opportunity to participate. Remedial courses are designed in the college schedule to assist slow learners to overcometheir exam anxiety. Following every exam and assignment, teachers directly address any problems or challenges that students have encountered. Slow learners are encouraged to participate in topic-related talks, seminars, and interactive sessions for participative learning. Teachers assist students who learn slowly by paying careful attention to their performance. Every teacher uses the WhatsApp or Telegram app to communicate with their students and help slower learners by providing them additional study material and topic-related notes.

Advanced learners

Advanced learners are identified through their multifaceted performance and they are encouraged to take part in additional curricula. Our college evaluates the learning levels of the students and encourages advanced learners by providing them access to reference books and research-focused studies via e-links or research gateways and they are encouraged to attend and participate in inter-collegiate events, small research projects, workshops, and conferences at the regional and national levels, showcasing their poster presentations and short project works

associated with their area of study.

Our students visit agro-based units, fields, and industries, which helps them comprehend the curriculum better. Students regularly participate in workshops, conferences, cultural events both inside and between colleges.

For more effective instruction, teachers make use of teaching aids like graphs, maps, and models, in addition to using the conventional chalk and board method to effectively communicate ideas. In life science courses, students are required to practice diagrams pertaining to physiology and histology. They receive curriculum-based homework assignments, participate in lengthy problem-solving sessions, and are required to submit hand written assignments, with diagrams drawn by hand, to improve their writing and drawing abilities.

The students are motivated and provided a platform to organize events at the college level, which develops leadership qualities, team-building skills and communication skills.

Students of the college are actively encouraged to participate in seminars, workshops, and national conferences as part of their holistic learning experience. The institution takes proactive steps by seeking approval from the university to provide financial assistance to students who represent the college at national-level festivals or competitions.

The college enables participating students by facilitating the concerned staff members to join them at the event, providing intellectual and moral support. This fosters the student'spursuit of excellence.

Projects are assigned to students by departments such as Botany, Chemistry, Geography, Physics, Microbiology, Industrial Fish and Fisheries, and Zoology, aiming to spark their interest in research. The College Gymkhana organizes quizzes and cultural activities to help students develop their talents and creativity.

Regarding the evaluation process and reforms, the college abides by the University's rules and regulations. The committee prepares the college's academic calendar well in advance of the start of each semester, according to the University's Calendar of Events. A uniform calendar for internal tests is created for each semester and sent to the students in accordance with the planned sequence of events.

There is one practical Internal Assessment (IA) and two theory internals (IA-1 & IA-2) assessments for each semester. To uphold academic standards, the IA is conducted according to the timetable, and the evaluation is completed using the Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) system. The assessment process includes:

- The individual teacher's sets the questions.
- The concerned departments conduct and evaluate Internal Assessments.
- The evaluated marks are displayed on the departmental notice boards.
- If there are any discrepancies, students are informed to contact the departmental head. The concerned staff members rectify any discrepancies.
- If a student has missed any test due to a genuine reason, he/she will be required to provide supporting documents for the absence. These students are given another opportunity to take the test.
- The teachers identify slow learners and address their concerns shortly after the test.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The Campus area is 55 acres of land having natural landscape. There are 36 buildings in 34,741.74 Sq.Mtrs of built up area. The college has independent establishments with adequate physical and academic amenities for UG / M.Sc and PhD programmes.

- The classrooms (35), Seminar hall (8) are Technology enabled. There are 30 well equipped laboratories.
- There are 5 museums namely Botany Museum, Geology Museum, Zoology Museum, Geography Museum and Criminology and Forensic Science Museum.
- The college has a central library with a separate two storied building spanning over an area of 3440.52 square metres. Recently a 24 X 7 (992 Sq Mtrs) Library having spacious two reading halls is established.
- Kaveri girl's hostel accommodates 500 students. The facilities include Mess hall, Reading room, TV room, solar water heater, 24x7 Security vigilance and other extracurricular facilities are also augmented. The boy's students are accommodated in Godhavari and Thungabhadra hostels.
- Independent units like the NSS, NCC, Grievance Redress Unit, Counseling and Career Guidance, Placement Unit, Health Centre, Canteen, Recreational spaces for staff and students, Auditorium, Alumni Association, a new commercial complex are established.
- The electrical supply is by HESCOM, 03 Transformers (20 KV) installed by HESCOMand 04 Transformers installed by the college. Solar energy panels installed with the capacity of 100 AH. The LED advantage is utilized. The water resources include Municipal Water and 12bore wells.
- Apart from main garden, each department is well maintained with Gardens and beautified the campus.
- Adequate parking facility and Separate Wash rooms (09+08) for gents and ladies are facilitated.

The working schedule is 8 am to 8 pm except Sunday and government holidays.

- The reading room accommodates 450 students. New Arrivals of

There are more than 1.82 lakhs books, 28 Journals / Magazines, 31,35,000 e-books, 6,000 e- journals, Shodh Sindhu and Shodhganga to students and faculty members. The library has CCTV surveillance system, barcode scanner, printer, and audio-video unit are facilitated.

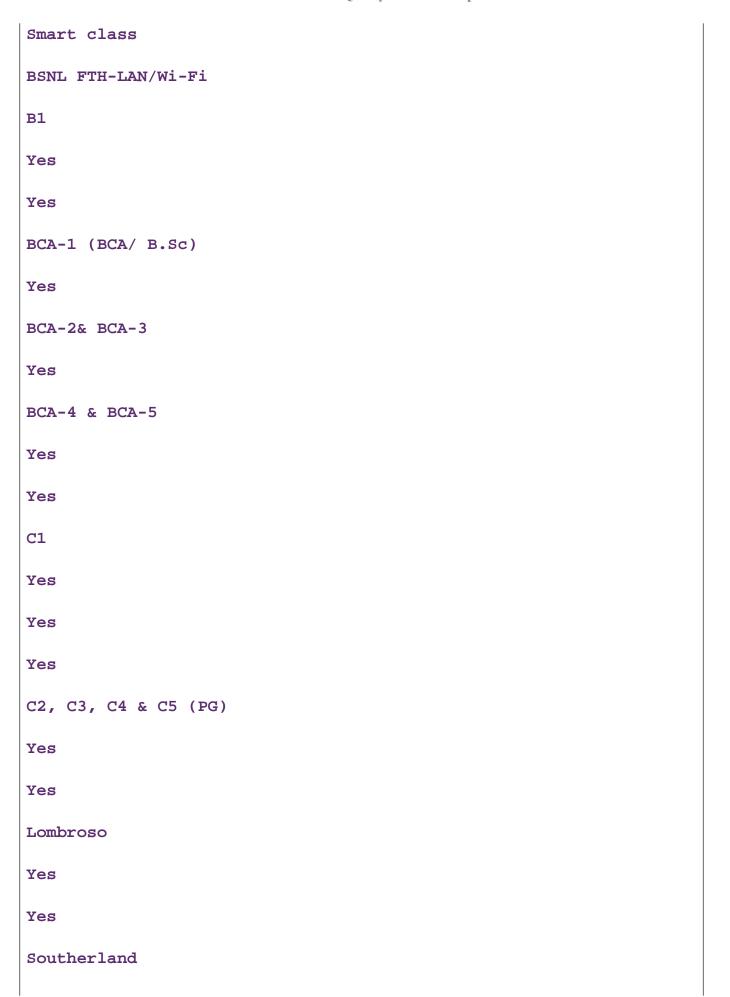

Organizational structures and Governing body

Karnatak Science College, Dharwad, a Constituent College of Karnatak University since 1958, addresses North Karnataka's educational needs. Operating under the Governing Body (GB), constituted by the Vice-Chancellor, Registrar, Syndicate member, Director for Student Welfare Office, Principal, Professors, Associate Professors, and Senior Assistant Professor, it aligns with University directives.

Administrative setup:

The administrative hierarchy, led by the Principal, involves HODs, Coordinators, teaching & non-teaching staff, IQAC, and committees. The management of the collegerotates Headship among Associate Professors every two years. If no Associate Professor is present, the Coordinator role goes to an Assistant Professor on a two-year

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rotation. Library structure includes the Librarian, Assistant Librarian, and subordinate staff.

Recruitment Procedure:-

Recruitment follows UGC regulations and KCSR rules, with approved posts advertised publicly. Screening committees assess applications, and successful candidates are chosen based on merit by the appointment committee, then approved in the syndicate meeting. Temporary staff fills gaps, with non-teaching posts on a contract basis. Permanent teaching staff progress through the Carrier Advancement Scheme (CAS) after fulfilling eligibility criteria.

Service rules:

Service conditions for permanent teachers adhere to UGC regulations and Government of Karnataka rules, while non-teaching staff follows KCSR rules and University guidelines. The administrative setup, recruitment, and service rules collectively contribute to the institution's goals, vision, and mission.

To enhance the effectiveness of teaching and learning, and to produce skill-based, employable graduates and postgraduates, various pedagogies, including project-based learning, self-

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learning, student seminars, industry-assisted project work, and peer-assisted learning, are introduced. Project-based learning is incorporated into BCA and PG courses to improve understanding and enable students to apply knowledge in real-time. In this context, IQAC consistently reviews and takes steps to enhance the quality of the teaching-learning process.

The academic calendar is prepared in advance, displayed, circulated in the institute, and strictly followed. Notifications regarding admission to various programs, summer, winter, and midterm vacations, examination schedules, and result declarations are included in the academic calendar. Newly admitted students are properly guided in the induction program, where they become familiar with the learning campus environment, the uniqueness of the education system, the teaching-learning process, continuous evaluation systems, compulsory core courses, various co-curricular activities, and the institute's discipline and culture. All students are acquainted with the campus and its various facilities. Before the commencement of classes for a particular semester, students are informed about the timetable, program structure, and course syllabi. Important announcements are made during the morning assembly, and the Principal monitors class attendance and conduct. IQAC collects feedback from students in virtual mode, and students are also free to approach the Principal for feedback and suggestions. Solid Waste Management:

The management of our institution has appointed sweepers and cleaning staff to remove the plastic and organic waste materials in the campus and dispose them effectively. Separate pits/dust bins are maintained in several places onthecampus.

Vermicompost Pit:

The degradable waste generated from our college, such as left-over eatables, and dried leaves from the garden is raw material for vermicompost. These raw materials are added every day (left-over eatables) and dried leaves are added every week to the vermicompost pit.

E-Waste Management:

All electronic e-waste materials like memory chips, motherboard, cartridges, computers printers, Fax, compact discsetc. generated by computer lab, electronics lab and physics lab are collected centrally and send to the University.

Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management: Basic science courses like department of physics uses weak radio isotopes (of allowed level of activity) supplied by authorized suppliers (permitted by DAE BARC) for teaching basic Nuclear Physics experiments to UG and PG Students.

Liquid Waste: The liquid waste includes sewage water, laboratory, cafeteria and hostel effluents. The sewage water generally will not contain any hazardous substances. it will be let into the drainage system. The liquid waste from experiments containing toxic substances from laboratory in department of chemistry, zoology, microbiology, biotechnology will be treated by using alternate chemicals, and mild hazardous substance will be neutralized in the laboratory level (by adapting Standard Operating Procedure).

The instutution has study circles in all departments in order to create a platform for students to interact with scientists and to involve in extra-curricular scientific activities.

Evidence of Success:

Students are actively involved in conducting research along with their studies, as evidenced by their research publications and awards/certificates.

II. Solid waste management:

Objectives:

- i.Waste generating places have been identified, and dustbins are placed to segregate wet and dry solid waste.
- ii. Awareness has been created among the students about the impact of cleanliness on health and well-being.
- iii. Campus green auditing and carbon-sequestration is taken up. Proper maintenance of e-waste isdone.

Context:

- i.With two thousand students studying in the college, the generation of solid waste is natural. Hence, it is essential to develop protocols and healthy practices to keep the campus free from pollution.
- ii. Wet waste is converted into a compost and using it as manure in the garden.

The Practices:

- 1. Dry solid waste is emptied by the municipal corporation, whereas the wet waste is dumped in pits for biocomposting.
- 2. Harnessing Solar Energy: SixSolar Hot water units of 500 litre each capacity was installed in Hostels.

7.3.1 - Portray the performance of the Institution in one area distinctive to its priority and thrust within 200 words

Research & Development:

Karnatak Science College dharwad has the unique distinction ofcontributing significantly tothe field of Research & Development. The faculties of the college are actively involved in interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary research. Twenty faculty members are recognized as research guides for guiding Ph.D scholars. The college has ten departments, out of which nine departments have been recognized as research centers bythe Karnatak University. The college undertakesresearch in the field of Physical Sciences, Biological Sciences and Earth Sciences. The faculties are engaged in a wide varietyof research viz, in synthesizing effective drug molecules, in developing effective methodologies for preparing biodegradable polymers, preparing biofuels from non-edible seeds, developing methods for ecofriendly electrodes and in identifying bioactive molecules in plants, anddeveloping polymer films/composite films for optical applications. Similarly, the departments concerned with life sciences areworking on biodiversity, medicinal and aromatic plants, biosystematic, microbiological evaluation and bioinformatics. During this academic year, 106 research articles have beenpublished in reputed international/ national journals. The Karnatak Science College also received grants from funding agency viz., DST-SERB. UGC, VGST worth more than Rs. 2 crores, and has procuredsophisticated instruments . The staff members are having h -index rangingfrom 3 to 14, and have published in journals with impact factor varying from 0.35 to 9.74. This type of research work is a distinctive feature of the college, and is unique among the degree colleges in the region.
