#### REPORT ON

ONE WEEK WORKSHOP
"AWARENESS ON CYBERCRIME"
(05-05-2025 to 11-05-2025)

A one week workshop on awareness on cybercrime was inaugurated by Shri A. Channappa, Registrar of Karnatak University, Dharwad (KUD) on 5th May 2025. The Registrar shared insights regarding how the increased usage of electronic devices leads to breach of private and confidential data. He also advised students to use technology wisely as cybercrime is a faceless crime. Dr. Venu Madhava, Professor and Chairman, Dept of Criminology and Forensic Science of KUD, the resource person of the inaugural day, presented a brief introduction about cybercrime, crypto-currency, PDA, NCRB, Corporate crimes, cyber phishing, spoofing, and security controls. He also quoted "A device addiction is a nonchemical addiction". Later, the audience gained knowledge about "Social Media Addiction" from Prof. S. K. Pawar, Director of Student Welfare, KUD, who explained about the same with many examples. Prof. (Smt.) M. S. Salunke, Principal of Karnatak Science College Dharwad gave the presidential remarks. She advised students not to share personal photos in stories and status put up online, and to use social media securely. On the second day of workshop i.e., on 6-5-25, Shri. Mallangouda Patil, (CCP, Dist. Special Branch, SP office, Dharwad) addressed students about digital applications like email, Meesho, Instagram, telegram, and matrimony apps. He explained about the various types of cybercrime frauds, like ATM frauds, OTP frauds, job frauds, and loan frauds. He even gave relevant information about many government applications and portals like KSP app, KAVACHA app, CEIR portals, and about CEN police station helpline numbers. He also covered new topics like card skimming, stock market frauds, and online frauds, Any desk and other checking apps. Students felt that the session was very informative and most useful. On third day, dated 7<sup>th</sup> May 2025, the students participating in the workshop visited the Cyber, Economic and Narcotics (CEN) Police station to gain both theoretical and practical knowledge regarding cybercrime cases. Mr. Shivanand Katagi, Dy. SP, CEN, Dharwad, addressed the students. He advised the students to use social media viz., Instagram, WhatsApp, among many others in

order to acquire information about current affairs, and to make themselves updated to current knowledge globally. While using social media, he suggested the use of two factor authentication. The Dy. SP also gave few examples on how innocent people's Aadhar, PAN and phone numbers been used by fraudsters during financial crime. He insisted all the students to provide awareness to the innocent people not to give their personal information, especially their Aadhar, Phone number, OTP and PAN. With few examples, he convinced the audience regarding how people have become victims in these cases, although they really do not involve in it. Later, on the same day, the participants of the workshop learnt about the entire procedure of filing a police complaint, till the charge-sheet is filed by the SHO. They learnt about Antanalyzer device that has many tools for recovering deleted files, photos, audios, videos, messages, call logs, and tracking IP addresses from Smt. Sreelatha, PSI, CEN. On the 4th day of the one-week workshop, dated 8th May 2025, the students who participated in the workhop visited the Central Prison, Dharwad, where they observed the basic facilities provided to prisoners like kitchen, rehabilitation centres like library, FM radio station, legal aid room, temples and a hall for prayer. In the women's prison, the students noticed a bakery section and some women prisoners preparing woollen textile materials and some others involved in candle making. The Jailor, Smt. Deepa, provided information about the type of crimes done by the women prisoners, and the type of punishment for the same. Smt. Deepa advised the students to follow rules and respect law and order. On the 5th day of the workshop, dated 9th May 2025, Mr. Akshay Nagraj Naik, CEO and Co-founder of Agamya Cyber tech, who arrived as the resource person, shared insights on cyber bullying, dark web, identity theft, hacking, phishing and also about the psychological impact of cyber bullying and the importance of reporting such behaviour. He also showed the participants of the workshop, mainly students, how to turn on private DNS mode on their Android cellphones, which is a secure internet connection. On the 6th day of workshop, dated 10th May 2025, Mr. Akshay Nagraj Naik, briefed the audience about digital literacy, by mentioning the types of phishing and malware attacks, cyber-stalking, cyber harassment, computer sabotage, pornographic offences, packet sniffing, malicious codes including trojans, viruses, logic bombs, Do's and Dont attacks, email bombing, and salami. On 12-05-2025, Smt. Sreelatha, from CEN, Dharwad was the resource person at the valedictory function on the last day of the workshop. Smt. Sreelatha alerted the girl students, irrespective of their intimacy with anybody, not to share their personal details, like photos and videos. Smt. Sreelatha said that if anyone's mobile got hacked and due to this, if her contacts get any irrelevant messages or images, the students should not get panicked, but should immediately approach CEN. The

talk was very informative, and enriched the participants of the workshop with knowledge about many aspects of cyber-related issues. Kaveri Ladies (Block II) students were assured the Warden that they will use their mobile/ cellphone securely and judicially, taking care not to become a victim of cyber-crime. They also promised to educate the ordinary people about cyber-crime and how to tackle it.
